

## SHORT TERM TRAVEL GRANT

Richard Charles Lee Canada - Hong Kong Library  
University of Toronto

The Asian Institute and the Richard Charles Lee Canada - Hong Kong Library (RCLL) are accepting proposals for research projects that utilize the Library at the University of Toronto. Accepted research proposals will be awarded up to CDN\$1,000. Proposed research visits to the library must be at least one week long. Funds must be used within one year of receiving notice of award.

The RCLL houses approximately 50,000 volumes, including 2,500 periodical titles and newspapers, 940 reels of microfilm and an expansive collection of audio-visual materials. The library also houses a fully indexed collection of 15 Chinese and English newspapers, totaling more than half a million microfilm frames. The RCLL is the largest research collection on Hong Kong and Canada-Hong Kong studies outside of Hong Kong. While in Toronto, researchers will have access to the University of Toronto library system, ranked for its collection among the top five research libraries in North America. Proposals are due two times per year: October 15 and March 15. Decisions will be communicated to winning proposals within one month.
