

**INTERNATIONAL COURSE MODULE
INDONESIA READING WEEK FIELD SCHOOL
February 12 to 21, 2010**

WHAT? During reading week of 2010, a delegation of 11 top students will travel to Bandung, Indonesia for an intensive field study course. The program seeks applications from exceptional students –future leaders–in the Faculty of Arts and Science wishing to take part in this exciting learning opportunity. Indonesia, as the world’s fourth most populous nation, occupies a vital yet understudied role in Asia’s dynamic development. The trip will provide opportunities for students to meet Indonesian students and scholars who are working in a wide range of research and policy areas, including economic development, urban planning, and immigration politics. Students will engage in dialogue with civil society groups, researchers, and government leaders.

WHEN? Students will depart for Indonesia on **Friday, February 12, 2010, and return on Sunday February 21, 2010.** There will be some pre-departure meetings/sessions which participants will be expected to attend.

COST? The cost of the Indonesia field school (airfare, ground transportation, meals and hotel accommodation) will be covered by the University of Toronto’s Faculty of Arts and Science International Course Module Program as well as the Asian Institute and the Dr. David Chu Program in Asia-Pacific Studies. Aside from personal incidental costs, **there will be no cost to the student.**

ELIGIBILITY? All third and fourth year undergraduate students in the Faculty of Arts and Science are eligible to apply. Applicants will need to provide: (i) a vita or resume (ii) a one-page statement of purpose and (iii) a copy of your unofficial transcript (copied and pasted from ROSI into a Word document). These are to be emailed to asian.institute@utoronto.ca by **Monday, January 11, 4pm**, with subject line “Application for Indonesia Reading Week Field School.” Successful applicants will be notified shortly thereafter.
